CONDITION:

The can of human meat is an entirely rusted can with a printed paper label around the cylinder. The lid is attached and in tact, and the bottom of the can is missing.

The lid of the can is the best preserved. There are spots on exterior that do not have any rust or deterioration. However there is also a spot were the rust is blackened, as if it has been burned. This blackened area is where the rust is flaking off the most. On the interior of the lid there are similar spots of decreased or no deterioration or rusting, almost mirror to the spots on the exterior. The lid seems to have been replaced incorrectly, with the edges on the inside of the can's cylinder, with one dent right below the edge of the can on the inside of the cylinder. However the lid is now imbedded into the cylinder.

The label of the can has had the rust deterioration seep through the paper label. It is fully attached to the can, except in one area where the dent below the lid is. There are some spots on the label that are not from the rust, but are points of dirt around the can that do not appear to be a danger to the object.

The bottom rim of the can is slightly dented, but not at a distressed level. On the internal edge of the rim is evidence of the oil from the contents of the can that have congealed into the rust of the can. The rust along the internal walls of the cylinder is complete. Although it is consitently covered in rust, the colour differs in areas from orange to brown.

HANDLING NOTES:

There is the possibility of conservation work for the can- specifically stabilising the rust flaking, however complete removal of the rust would take away from the history of the object for the

purposes of this exhibition. This can should be displayed on a plinth or base to contain the rust coming off the object, as well it should be displayed with like objects, like the other cans in this exhibition, to not risk the other objects.

The can should always be handled with gloves because of the rust deterioration. The flaking rust is more susceptible to touch than vibration, so handling should be limited.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS:

Should not be displayed in the vicinity of a heating source or direct sunlight. Light levels (lux) below UV: below 75 μ W per lumen Temperature (°C): 18-24 ± 4 in 24 hour period RH: 40-60% ± 10% in 24 hour period
